

Prof NGUYEN MANH Hung, Director General, Institute of African and Middle East Studies, Hanoi, Vietnam

Associate Professor Nguyen Manh Hung is Director General of the Institute for Africa and Middle East Studies (IAMES) in Hanoi (Vietnam) since 2014. He received his PhD from the University of Delaware, USA.

His research interests are conflict resolution, governance and political economy of development, with a focus on the comparative studies between Asia and Africa.

He has conducted extensive research on the regional disputes and development issues in Africa and Asia. He has been working as consultant for a number of international organizations such as the Swiss Agency for Development and Cooperation, Asian Development Bank, the World Bank, etc.

In 2013-2014, he was Deputy Director General of the Institute of World Economics and Politics, Vietnam Academy of Social Sciences. In 2008-2013, he was Director of the Centre for International Security and Strategy Studies, Institute of World Economics and Politics, Vietnam Academy of Social Sciences. Since 2016, he is a Member of Vietnam's Central Theoretical Council. Since 2014, he is Team leader, Monitoring of Context Changes Relevant for Development in Cambodia, Lao PDR, Myanmar and Vietnam (MERV Report), the Swiss Agency for Development and Cooperation (SDC).
